BY-LAW # 7

TOWN SOLICITOR BY-LAW

- 1) This By-Law shall be known as and may be cited as the “Solicitor By-Law”.
- 2) The Council may appoint a Barrister of the Supreme Court of not less than two years standing to be the Town Solicitor, who shall hold office subject to the provisions of Section 98 or the Towns Act.
- 3) The solicitor when Council so directs, shall perform the following duties for the Town:
 - (a) give legal advise and assistance to the Mayor and councillors and the Town officials in the performance of the duties of their respective offices;
 - (b) attend all meetings of the Council when notified and meetings of any committee when required to do so;
 - (c) draft and revise all legal documents required by the Town;
 - (d) take charge of and manage all the legal business connected with the affairs of the Town;
 - (e) draft all proposed legislation on behalf of the Town and all necessary documents in connection therewith;
 - (f) attend before any committee of the legislature on behalf of the Town;
 - (g) act as solicitor in council for the Town in all actions to which the Town is a party, or which are conducted on behalf of or on the part of the Town;
- 4) Council may appoint a Deputy Town Solicitor who shall, whenever he is requires by the Town Solicitor, or, in the case of the absence of the Town Solicitor from the Town or of his incapacity or disqualification through illness, interest or otherwise, perform the duties of Town Solicitor.
- 5)
 - (a) When deemed advisable, the Town Solicitor may, with the approval of the council retain additional counsel in respect of any matter.
 - (b) When no Town Solicitor has been appointed a solicitor retained by the

Council for any matter or cause shall proceed and shall have and exercise all the rights and duties of the Town Solicitor in respect to said matter or cause as if he were the Town Solicitor, and in accord with his retainer.

- 6) All former Town Solicitor By-Laws of the Town of Mulgrave as hereby repealed and this By-Law substituted therefore.

Resolution:

RESOLVED the Town Council of the Town of Mulgrave that the attached Town Solicitor by-Law be and the same is hereby enacted and that the Clerk be and is hereby instructed to forward same to the Minister of Municipal Affairs with a request for his approval thereof.
